What is an Ombudsman?

Ombudsmen serve as advocates for residents in nursing homes and assisted living facilities. In Carroll County, we have:

- 10 nursing homes ranging in size from 60 beds to 150 beds.
- 30 assisted living facilities ranging in size from 3 beds to 100 beds.
- 921 licensed skilled nursing beds in total.
- 875 licensed assisted living beds in total.

- Routinely visit long-term care residents
- Help resolve residents' complaints and concerns
- Protect and uphold resident rights
- Support Resident Councils and Family Councils
- Provide placement information
- Offer information and assistance on matters related to long-term care
- Provide community education on topics including resident rights and elder abuse
