## Subject: Initiation of "reroute" procedure

Despite our ongoing collaborative efforts with the Carroll Hospital Center (CHC/ED) we continue to be challenged with the disposition and timely "off-loading/transfer" of our EMS patients. As a result, we frequently find the receiving facility overwhelmed and in a static situation due to inability for patient movement caused by several dynamics.

As a result, there will be situations in which the hospital ED will be placed in a "reroute status." The initiation of "reroute" will first be assessed and will be a joint effort between the ED charge or senior level staff in concert with designated EMS personnel who are authorized to enact the "reroute status." As a result, the following guidelines will be initiated to manage this status:

## Criteria:

- 1. The hospital is on both a red and yellow alert status
- 2. There is no jurisdictional blue alert (major weather event or other)
- 3. There are no physical places to transition patients: (stretchers, waiting room, wheelchairs)
- 4. Greater than four (4) EMS units have been waiting or have a potential offload time of > 1 hour as verified by the triage or charge nurse.
- 5. The ED has no remaining options for patient transition

## **Procedure:**

- 1. The above criteria have been met
- 2. Contact a Carroll County Fire & EMS official:
  - A. EMSOPS officer-David Coe (EMS-10) 443-375-0642
  - B. Director-Michael Robinson (FD-1) 667-272-9844
- 3. The official will place Carroll ED on "reroute" through the ECC or decide to the contrary.
- 4. The "reroute" status will be confirmed via the ECC (Carroll)
- 5. The ECC will make an announcement typically on Talkgroup-A3 as to the status and a CAD message will be sent to all printers.
- 6. After a period of three (3) hours the "reroute" status will expire unless renewed by #2 above.

Your patience and cooperation relative to the above is appreciated as are your continued efforts in the provision of quality EMS care.
